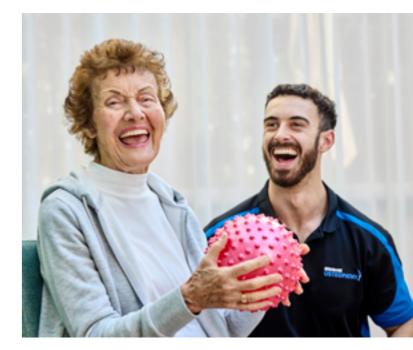
Keep moving with VMCH's Movement Matters gentle exercise class
